

For Isaiah, it would be a prophecy fulfilled.³ For Mary, the arrival of The Promised Child.⁴ For you and me, Christmas brought The Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world.⁵ If there is anything we recognize, surely it is the sin of this world. There are those who have heard about the "*reason*"



for the season". There are others who know Him. Still, all are so easily distracted by the sights and sounds of a modern, commercialized Christmas.

People go through Thanksgiving without knowing Who to thank. The four weeks following, patrons scurry from store to store until midnight of the twenty-fourth. Christmas Day everyone eats their fill, tears into presents, and collapses onto the couch. Then suddenly glasses are being raised to welcome the New Year, and Jesus has been left in the manger - or totally forgotten. Would it not be life changing to actually acknowledge our need for, and the Gift of, the Savior?
